I graduated in Biology and Biochemistry at the University of the Balearic Islands in 2003. Then I moved to Barcelona to pursue a PhD at the University of Barcelona, studying the metabolism of ketone bodies. As a postdoc at the Icahn School of Medicine at Mount Sinai in New York, I became interested in understanding the epigenetic and epitranscriptomic mechanisms that govern stem cell function. I joined the Wallenberg Center in Molecular Medicine at Umeå University in October 2016 as an independent researcher. Our research is based on understanding gene expression regulation mechanisms, specifically, how epigenetic and epitranscriptomic marks regulate ovarian and breast cancer, and stem cell biology.
