

Alvaro Rada Iglesias received his M.Sc. in Biology by the University of León in 2001, being recognized as the best academic curriculum of that year. Then, he obtained his PhD in 2007 at Uppsala University (Sweden), where he worked in the laboratory of Prof. Claes Wadelius. After a short post-doctoral work in the Linnaeus Centre for Bioinformatics (Uppsala University, Sweden) under the supervision of Prof. Jan Komorowski, he obtained an EMBO long-term fellowship to continue his postdoctoral career in the laboratory of Prof. Joanna Wysocka at Stanford University (USA), where he stayed between 2009-2013. In 2013, he was recruited by the University of Cologne as a Junior Research Group Leader at the Centre for Molecular Medicine Cologne, where he successfully started his independent research group. This was recognized with an EMBO Young Investigator award (EMBO YIP) in 2017. In July 2018 he was recruited as a Principal Investigator by the University of Cantabria to direct his research group at the Institute of Biomedicine and Biotechnology of Cantabria (IBBTEC). In 2020, he became "Científico Titular" at the Spanish National Research Council (CSIC), where he got promoted to "Profesor de Investigación" in 2025. In recent years, his work has been recognized by an *EMBO Young Investigator* award (EMBO YIP; 2017), the *José Luís Gómez Skarmeta* award (2020) and an ERC Consolidator grant (2019).
